- CBCAP was reviewed in 2004

PART

- Evidence-Based Practice Efficiency Measure accepted Summer 2006
 - A baseline was collected in December 2006 on a continuum
 - Points on the continuum are:
 - Emerging Programs and Practices
 - Promising Programs and Practices
 - Supported Programs and Practices
 - Well-Supported Programs and Practices

CBCAP Matrix

- Identifies existing evidence-based programs
- Rates programs where they fall along the CBCAP Part Continuum
- To be used as a tool in considering the best path to take

This matrix only contains programs reviewed on one of the four registries listed as of December 2007 that were identified through an initial screening to have relevance to CBCAP outcome goals. If a program is not identified in this matrix, it does not necessarily mean that the program is ineffective or harmful. The matrix is intended to be a living document that will be updated and expanded periodically at intervals as yet to be determined. FRIENDS also recommends that this matrix be used in conjunction with the Evidence-Based Practices into CBCAP Programs- A Tool for Critical Discussions to help determine that most appropriate program to meet the needs to the population and community to be served.
