## Building Systems of Care

### Comprehensive Community Mental Health Services for Children and Their Families

The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration, Center for Mental Health Services funds six-year cooperative agreements for the Comprehensive Community Mental Health Services for Children and Their Families Program (also referred to as the Child Mental Health Initiative [CMHI]). The purpose of this program is to develop integrated home and community-based services and supports for children and youth with serious mental health needs and their families by encouraging the development and expansion of effective and enduring systems of care.

Below is a list of grantees awarded a cooperative agreement for developing systems of care, the year that they were awarded, the name of the initiative, and the county, city or territory for the initiative. Shaded communities are currently operating under a cooperative agreement. Many of the graduated communities (no longer receiving grant funding) have continued to sustain many or all of the system of care components.

Child welfare can learn from and build upon the successes of system of care communities. Making connections to CMHI system of care communities offer insights and strategies for:

- Implementing systems of care
- Delivering family-driven, youth-guided, and culturally competent services
- Promoting collaboration between mental health and child welfare systems
